Mark Turnage, DarkOwl CEO, delivered a thought-provoking overview of cyber warfare. Here are just a few highlights: ① Close proximity is not needed, and weapons can only be used once. ② Precise targeting limits loss of civilian life. ③ Implications of private actors getting involved (Ukraine-Russia war - 200,000 hackers!) are not understood. ④ Lower cost than traditional war makes it easier for countries. ⑤ So far, cyber hasn't been decisive. ⑥ Can its use be governed?
