Jerry Stooksbury, Citizen Member of the Board of Commissioners for Northern Colorado Regional Airport (code name FNL), presented a great overview of the status of the new airport. Highlights included these:

• The 19,400 sq ft terminal is designed for jet passenger service, with amenities like a modern TSA security checkpoint, and enhanced accessibility and baggage handling systems. • Funding includes \$16M from fed gov (CARES Act) and \$1M each from Fort Collins and Loveland. • Construction is expected to be complete by Q4 2024. • The next gen remote/virtual air traffic control system (currently an FAA test bed) will share control with the traditional tower-based system.
