"A Black Brother's Journey" by **George Stevens** 

Mallory (Thompson Valley H.S.).

Highlights of George's inspiring life story included the following:



- Humble beginnings: born, raised in So. Philadelphia; schooled in West Philly (better schools); grew up fatherless; mother (who lived to age 86, well after bout with TB) believed in the value of education and instilled it in George
- Early influences: mother introduced him to the public library and joy of reading; "old-timers" taught him how to play checkers and chess
- Work ethic: took on jobs, early on, selling newspapers, pumping gas, and delivering prescriptions
- Course correction: while mom hospitalized, he joined a gang; afterwards turned life around with church, basketball, and scouting (an Eagle Scout)
- Higher education: starting with GI Bill (1968), he eventually earned Doctorate of Bus Admin (1979)
- Academic career: has enjoyed teaching and research at various universities for over 40 years
- George's testimony: "I feel SO blessed to have had the help of so many people throughout my life... First of all, I always give glory to God!"
