(Sad News): Marilynn Heth passed away recently. Thoughts and prayers are with Mo, in his loss. Dave Mills (Literacy): Our club's check for \$33,829 was presented to Thompson School District to fund 2 projects: ① \$56/student/year in books for 712 Ist & 2nd graders at 9 low income schools, and ② a Multimedia Module (enabling students to produce and edit audio podcasts and videos) for Sarah Milner Elementary School.

tation: • Founded (1982) in the basement of a Loveland church, ATV's mission is to provide shelter, advocacy, education, and resources for people impacted by domestic violence, sexual assault, and human trafficking. • Victims suffer from verbal and financial abuse long before they suffer physical violence. • Many incidents go unreported. • In 2022, ATV provided services to over 1,600 individuals and responded to over 1,400 crisis calls.
