PROGRAM: Doug Rutledge introduced Mike Scholl who has served Downtown Loveland as the Economic Develop Manager for 11 years. Mike graduated from the University of Michigan with a Degree in Urban Planning. Mike discussed The Foundry project and about how the city worked to mitigate and clean up 3rd Street and Cleveland Avenue and helped develop it into a movie theater. The city cleaned up many sites downtown that are now part of The Foundry and provided mitigation to make the sites safer for the community. Now there is an artistic parking garage, a Marriot hotel, a movie theatre, apartments and restaurants that all bring more people to Downtown Loveland. The Foundry also has a plaza that can host events. The city is also working on renovating the Pullium Community Building. The DDA has plans to develop more downtown and the city has plans for east and west Loveland in the future.
