year has been "Doing Whatever it Takes for Youth, Families, and Communities to be Successful." Highlights of her remarks included the following:

- Kaycee has been proud to be associated with the organization ever since she joined in 2008, in South Dakota.
- BGCLC serves more than 3,000 youth in Loveland, Fort Collins, Estes Park, and Wellington.
- They pivoted quickly and creatively when COVID challenges started, to plan how to remain accessible to the kids who need them the most.
- March-May: They offered emergency childcare for essential healthcare workers and first responders, as well as new activity kits and virtual programs.
- June-August: BGCLC opened II different locations for their full-day summer program in the County, hired a licensed clinical social worker to support the mental health needs of the staff, and formally launched a Thompson School District partnership.
- September-November: Across the County, they
 opened Remote Learning Centers for youth to go
 to while not in school. They launched an Estes
 Park School District partnership, as well as opened
 emergency sites for youth evacuated from fires.
