Now, one year later, the man has completed his Work Release, has a good job, and has been sober for I full year (for the first time in 30 years!).

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Fellow Rotarian and Loveland Fire Chief **Tim Sendelbach** presented an update on





Loveland Fire Rescue Authority. To introduce this presentation, **Gail Daugherty** shared what it was like to have a house completely burned down by a wildfire (west of Walsenburg, in 2018). Here are some other highlights of Chief Sendelbach's remarks:

- One of LRFA's chief focus, areas (in its 2023-2027 Strategic Plan) is high-risk area fuel mitigation. These are areas defined in the Community Wildfire Preparedness Plan (CWPP), available at LFRA.org.
- An Air Boss (Air Curtain Burner) will be used throughout the LFRA response district to safely burn slash gathered by members of the community. This unit will allow LFRA to burn slash in a safe and environmentally friendly way almost year-round.
- LFRA envisions a training center near Fairgrounds
 Park to include a Community Safety Village designed specifically to educate kids from kindergarten
 to high school about fire safety.
- All Rotarians interested in helping their neighbors in time of need are encouraged to attend one of the First On the Scene (FOTS) sessions presented monthly at fire stations in the LFRA response area.
