Guest speaker Tara Hunter, whose grandmother Felicia LaVon Johnson was a member of the distinguished Six Triple Eight Battalion during WWII, told the story about this all-Black, all-female U.S. Army unit. These women were vital for boosting our troops' morale by clearing massive mail backlogs in England and France. Led by their commanding officer, Lt. Col. Charity Adams, the Army's highest-ranking Black woman officer during the war, they faced extreme racism and sexism while working under harsh conditions to sort millions of letters and packages that helped soldiers feel connected.
