

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

CSU Chancellor Tony Frank delivered a fascinating look at the past, present, and future of U.S. higher ed. Some highlights: • It is entirely possible that college deferments during the Vietnam war draft negatively affected people's opinion of higher ed. • Rising tuition only became a problem (1980s) when public funding got squeezed by several factors. • A bright future is ahead as higher ed breaks from its linear *learn-then-work* model to establish new paths to education credentials.
