GOVERNOR'S ART SHOW

Brian Nienhaus reminded members that the 29th Annual Governor's Art Show is coming up and the committee can still use help with sponsors. This year there are 59 artists who have been juried into the show, including Legacy Artists and popular artists from 2019. The art show will have a Silent Auction again this year and have 10 pieces donated. The Gala is on April 24th and tickets are on sale on the show website.

PROGRAM

Phil Ashcraft introduced Telbe Storbeck who talked to the club about oil and gas development in Colorado. Mr. Storbeck is from Gillette, WY and attended Colorado Mesa University. He works for Occidental, which was Anadarko before merger, and lives in Denver. Paving, shoes, tires etc. are all a part of our everyday lives and are all related to the oil and gas industry. Over the next 30 years, there will be an increased demand for electricity, but oil and gas amounts show relatively flat growth. In our area, 7000-8000 feet deep horizontal drilling helps with returns and also mitigates the impact on the surface (fewer structures). Hydraulic fracturing is done for 5 to 8 days per well. The company also has a tankless design from drilling pad and use pipelines not trucks for transport, which helps reduce their carbon impact.
