Dixie Schmatz (Interact Success Story): Club members were treated to a special video by Brianne Salzmann, who founded our Big Thompson Interact Club, back in 2006. Ms. Salzmann told how her original motivation to start the Interact Club sprang from her wonderful experience at a RYLA camp in Estes Park. She also de-



scribed what's happened in her life since: getting both her undergraduate degree (speech-language-hearing sciences and business), as well as her doctorate (audiology) from CU-Boulder; and becoming a practicing audiologist in the Seattle area!

PROGRAM

Roger Berg, Water Utilities Manager for the City of Loveland presented an overview of the city's water operations, including these highlights:

- This large, complex group works around the clock (people on call 24x7) to ensure Loveland citizens have the water they need.
- Combined 2021 revenue is estimated at \$44 M, and it has a total staff of 80 employees.
- Over the past 100 years, Loveland has been acquiring Big Thompson River and Colorado River water rights - making for a very diverse portfolio.
- The water treatment plant was upgraded in 2016; a new, \$5 M water quality lab just opened; and construction on a new 5.5 million gallon water tank (to meet peak summer usage, provide better fire protection, and meet future demand) started in 2020.
