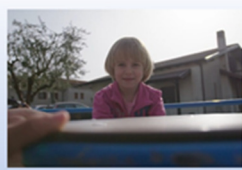

Highlights of "KidsPak Transition from LRC Foundation to 501c3" by our own **Tom Carrigan & Julie Johnson Haffner** included these highlights:

- Loveland Rotary Foundation announced KidsPak will become its own 501c3 tax-exempt nonprofit.
- The Foundation offered a hearty farewell and wishes for great success, while the KidsPak team expressed its appreciation for the Foundation's leadership.
- **Tom and Dick Bradsby** told the KidsPak story from its humble 2009 beginnings, as a *backpacks with food inside* program (partnering with House of Neighborly Services), delivering less than 30 food bags/week, to what it is today, after 800,000 total meals delivered and some 500 volunteers onboard.
- This 501c3 transition by KidsPak takes the financial and administrative burden off of the Foundation, now that the KidsPak scope of work and finances has come to exceed that of a typical Rotary project.
