HISTORY: Dixie Schmatz told us about Loveland Rotary during the 1950s: The Cosmopolitan, Lions and Rotary Clubs held joint meetings for special speakers; RI decided that club members called to military service or government service may be granted a leave of absence during a national emergency and receive credit for attendance; Rotarians are to wear Rotary name boutonnieres at Club meetings to benefit new members, visitors and old Rotarians with a lame memory. PROGRAM: Phil Ashcraft introduced Dr.

Donald Runnells who is the Professor Emeritus in the Dept of Geological Sciences at the Univ of Colorado, Boulder. He has a BS in Geology from the Univ of Utah and and MA/PhD in geology and geochemistry from Harvard. Dr. Runnells has always had an interest in history and WWI in particular. He talked to us about military history and some of the battlefields, monuments and cemeteries of WWI. He discussed the Battle of Verdun, the Battle of Flanders, the Battle of Passchendaele, the Battles of Chateau Thierry, Belleau Wood, and Meuse-Argonne.
