"Gravestones & Epitaphs" by **Alistair MacDonald** was a walk through many thought-provoking and surprising tales of remarkable people who've been memorialized - around the world - including these highlights:

- Dunblane Cathedral (Scotland): there lies a grave for a William McCowan who fought for the 58th Massachusetts infantry in the U.S. Civil War
- Lewis and Harris Island: Donald Macleod, at only 15 years old, was its youngest soldier killed in WW I
- York Minster Cathedral (England): entire obituary is carved in stone for Lora Burton Dawnay (aristocrat)
- South Africa wine district: grave of "Sacha" bears a salutation from Prince Buthelezi, Zulu fighter during apartheid, who later become interior minister
- Prague (Czech Republic): small brass plates among the cobblestones in streets commemorate Jews deported and killed in the Nazi concentration camps
