Diane Lapierre, along with Kathi Wright and Rodger Bailey (Thompson Valley Rotary), and Maureen Corey (Curator of Art, Loveland Museum) delivered the kickoff presentation for this year's Governor's Art Show & Sale. Over its 33-year history, this event has featured more than 500 Colorado artists and has raised more than \$4 M (after the 60% of sales to the artists) for both Rotary clubs and Thompson Education Foundation, to fund projects for at-risk youth, local nonprofits, and scholarships.
