Our own Marc Schaffer (TSD Superintendent), treated members to a story about his recent exploits while on an immersive philanthropic trip to Central America, where he worked with other volunteers (educators) to finish construction on a new school building made of walls of recycled plastic bottles (filled with litter) that would later be encased in concrete.
