David Rout, the Exec Director of Larimer County's Homeward Alliance, shared with us the history and community support programs of this organization, as well as ways we can support its efforts. Home-



ward Alliance, previously known as "Homeless Gear," is a Colorado-based non-profit that was founded in 2008. Its mission is to empower individuals and families who face homelessness. Its vision is "a community in which homelessness is rare, short-lived and non-recurring." It offers programs that provide for basic needs, housing-focused case management, and employment services. One of these programs is The Murphy Center for Hope (in Fort Collins) that serves as a "front door" for homeless services, including core human services, day shelter, and connection to 20 on-site partner agencies and services.
