

community support programs of this organization, as well as ways we can support its efforts. Home-



ward Alliance, previously known as "Homeless Gear," is a Colorado-based non-profit that was founded in 2008. Its mission is to empower individuals and families who face homelessness. Its vision is "a community in which homelessness is rare, short-lived and nonrecurring." It offers programs that provide for basic needs, housing-focused case management, and employment services. One of these programs is The Murphy Center for Hope (in Fort Collins) that serves as a "front door" for homeless services, including core human services, day shelter, and connection to 20 on-site partner agencies and services.
