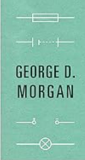
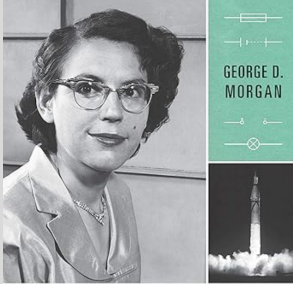

Dave Stewart, a Northern Colorado

Colorado River Crisis

environmental scientist, shared a riveting, sometimes disturbing video titled "Crisis on the Colorado." In it, experts including Dave himself outline all the issues affecting the Colorado River - e.g., the dwindling water levels, the many uses of water from the river (which exceed any reasonable expectation of future replenishment), the possible solutions to that problem, and inevitable consequences of those solutions. The *Colorado River Compact of 1922* (negotiated by seven states) was to manage a river with some 21 million acre feet of water per year. The river now has half that volume. The *Doctrine of Prior Appropriation* makes it hard for all parties involved to reach the required compromises.
