The Opening Night Gala is on May 3rd as well. **Carol Stark-Sorg** announced that the Greeley Red Eye Club is having their annual geranium sale so please let Carol know if you'd like any—she will also deliver them to you. **Fran Bostwick** and **Phil Ashcraft** updated the club on the Rotary clock for the Foundry. The committee exceeded their goal for fundraising which ended up helping out with installation and purchasing a bench with all Rotary members names. **HISTORY:** **Evan Patterson** read that in 1961, the club approved a small increase for meal to \$1.10 up from \$0.40 in 1937. In 1962, the Rotary Spokesman was mailed to all members with a \$0.03 stamp.

**PROGRAM:** **Gil Garcia** introduced John Blankinship who has a physics degree from MIT and an aeronautics/astronautics from Brooklyn Polytechnic Institute. John was employed by Grumman Aerospace during the time the Apollo module was built. This year is the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Apollo 11 landing on the moon. November 1967 was the first flight of the Saturn 5 rocket (for the Apollo 4 unmanned test mission) and the last launch was in 1972. No rocket since, including the one being built today can match the payload capacity of the Saturn 5. The Space Race started on Oct 4, 1957, when the Soviet Union launched Sputnik I into orbit. In 1958, NASA and educational programs were created by the US government to allow the US to compete. At the height of the program it required \$25 billion dollars, 400,000 individual people and the support of over 20,000 firms and universities for the Apollo program.
