**Phil Ashcraft** introduced Mitzi Moran who runs the Sunrise Community Health Center. They are a federally qualified health center that serves Larimer and Weld county. Over the last 10 weeks they have been working under their Covid19 plan. The center works with primarily non-insured and low income patients. They are maintaining their services by staying open but with a condensed clinic plan so they can maximize their PPE and have good infectious control procedures in place and implementing telehealth visits. Sunrise Community Health is also making sure staff and patients stay safe with distancing, temperature checks and PPE.
