LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

To start off this presentation about the 2023 Governor's Art Show & Sale, **Diane Lapierre** introduced **Chris White**, who described the relationship between the **Rotary Art Scholarships** and the **Governor's Art Show**. He related how this partnership between these two projects materialized: the two Rotary clubs (Thompson Valley club and Loveland club) joined up with Thompson Education Foundation and John Kincaid to come up with a pre-screening and application process for awarding art education scholarships to high school artists (both the visual arts and performing arts) with the requisite academic qualifications (for any higher ed program) who would submit their portfolios and required essays, along with their applications. This year, out of the 12 students who applied, 8 were selected to be interviewed and to subsequently receive either \$1,000 or \$4,000 scholarships.

Next, one of the artists being featured at the 2023 Governor's Art Show (who was also an arts scholarship recipient a number of years ago), **Luis Santacruz**, shared his personal journey from his beginnings as a young DACA ("Dreamer") immigrant and gay student artist to the boost he got as one of the art scholarship winners, and his rising success as a professional artist.
