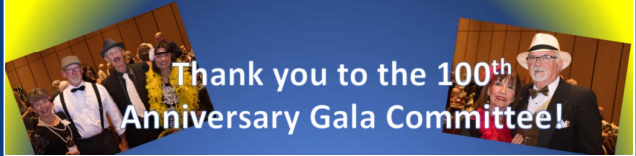

Our own **Mark Anderson, DVM**, fascinated members with a presentation on veterinary support in the "third-world country" in our own backyard: "Navajo Nation Behind the Blanket." Highlights included these:

• Navajo Nation is 27,413 sq miles (≈ South Carolina) and desolate with 6 people/sq mile

• Population: 30% have no electricity; 40% have no running water

• Only 1 Navajo vet for entire nation, though horses are sacred, and there are 72,000 feral horses

• This team's mission: • Provide basic veterinary care to underserved populations • Encourage and support Native American veterinarians and vet students with tribal liaison • Give other vet students clinical exposure to real cases and field surgeries
