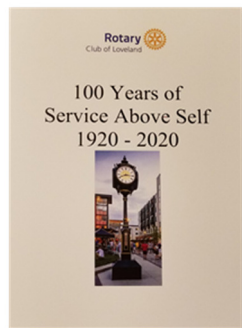
The following four new members were formally (though belatedly, due to COVID) inducted into our Loveland Rotary Club:

PROGRAM

Swedish author and entrepreneur Ihrén Abrahamsson presented the very 21st-century phenomenon of "Cryptocurrency and Bitcoin." Cryptocurrency - and Bitcoin, based on *blockchain* technology, particularly - is a digital (or virtual) currency that is slowly but surely revolutionizing our concept of *value*. This technology for exchanging and storing value is secured by cryptography and the continual verification of transactions by a worldwide network of computers, which as Ms. Abrahamsson explained, makes it utterly safe because it is impossible to close it down (hack it), counterfeit it, etc. It is impossible to hide (launder) Bitcoin, as well, and society may soon demand such transparency regarding their financial dealings from corporations and banks!
