President Jim gave a brief reminder of Rotary's mission: We provide service to others, promote integrity, and advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through our fellowship of business, professional, and community leaders. He gave an example of Highlands Ranch Rotary, which has made real progress with juvenile suicide, including improving juvenile mental health by raising \$500K for fellowships for psychiatric training for MD's.

David Snodgrass, MD, has hit the ground running as a new member of the club, replacing President Elect **Bob Tello** as the Polio Committee chairman. David gave an update on polio and Rotary's Polio Plus initiative, including



an exercise with all meeting attendees (<u>U</u>nvaccinated and <u>V</u>accinated), determined by cards we received when we arrived). He reminded us that Polio Plus began in 1985, that polio cases have been reduced by



99.9% since then and that 2.5 Billion children have been immunized. His recent data on polio cases included 120 cases of wild polio in 2020, but only 4 cases thus far this year. He ended by describing several ways Rotarians can make donations to Polio plus.

Carol Stark introduced our District Rotary Foundation Chair, Chris Woodruff, who recognized **Dick Wells** as the club's newest Paul



Harris Fellow. He also recognized **Bill Eads** as a new member of the Paul Harris Society and explained what each of these two recognitions signify.

"Can We Talk?" was a special program developed by our Fellowship Committee and led by Gail Daugherty, in which each table discussed topics like: what makes me happy, where I'd like to travel, what gives me awe and wonder, and what brought me to my profession.
