Duck Race

August 24, 2024

- Our annual Loveland Rubber Duck Race will take place, as usual, at the annual Corn Roast Festival in late August, before which our "big duck" float will join the Duck Race Parade.
- It takes volunteers Rotarians. Interact students. Boy Scouts, and others - to orchestrate all the Race Day activities including transporting more than 7,000 ducks down to the Big Thompson River starting line, where they are dumped out of large bins.
- It also takes many volunteer Rotarians to sell all of the race tickets (one assigned to each rubber duck)

that need to be sold to bring in the upwards of \$30,000 in net revenue that funds many of our club's worthy projects (via LRC Foundation) including scholarships, literacy projects, RYLA camps, and others.
