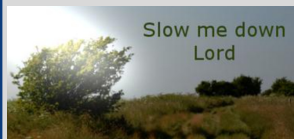

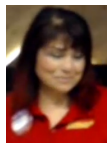

When it was learned - quite suddenly - that our scheduled speaker would not be able to come, our red badger **Lydia Wolfe**, Director of Development for Loveland's Habitat for



Humanity, graciously delivered an impromptu but thoroughly informative talk about this community-empowering nonprofit. Here are some key takeaways about the Loveland Habitat for Humanity organization:

- Loveland Habitat for Humanity was founded (1987) by a small group of Loveland's community and religious leaders, who saw the need for safe and affordable housing for low- to moderate-income residents.
- Their goal was to provide a hand-up, not a hand-out, to help families build and purchase an affordable home.
- Habitat volunteers build houses in partnership with families in need of decent, affordable housing. The houses are then sold to the families with an affordable mortgage and no interest.
- 35 years later, through the hard work of homeowners and volunteers, over 160 homes and 28 home preservation projects have been completed.
- On average, the Loveland office builds about 5-7 homes every year.
