Dick Barton (Memorial Day Memory): Dick shared a heartbreaking story about the only serviceman (Navy) under his command to lose his life in Vietnam.

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Ret. USAF Colonel (and our fellow Loveland Rotarian) Bob Eatman delivered our Memorial Day Program. Bob



shared his own memories of those who gave their lives. His remarks evoked strong emotion in both Bob and the audience. These are just a few highlights:

- † "Charlie" died when his fighter aircraft went out of control over the desert of Nevada. He ejected, but did not survive the ejection.
- † A B-52 crew of five from Bob's unit died (and were never found) when their aircraft crashed into the North Atlantic during a low level test of shore-based surveillance radars.
- † Bob's roommate, Gray Warren, was shot down during an interdiction mission one day before he and Bob were to join a Forward Air Controller (FAC) unit.

During Bob Eatman's 33-year military career, he flew 167 combat missions, logging more than 7,000 hours, in the F-4 Phantom II (in Vietnam), and was awarded the Silver Star, two Distinguished Flying Crosses, and 14 Air Medals. His final military assignment was commanding the Air Force ROTC Detachment at Colorado State University (1984-1987).
