PROGRAM

Our Memorial Day program was presented by Major Ryan Raleigh, Asst Prof of Military Science & Exec Officer of Army ROTC, Colorado State University.

Highlights included these:

- It is the position of Major Raleigh that “you don’t have to wear a uniform to be a service-first citizen.”
- Army ROTC is the largest commissioning source.
- Many CSU cadets earn a minor in military science.
- ROTC curriculum includes life skills, leadership, public speaking, professional writing, language training.
- CSU’s Army ROTC commissions 40-50 cadets/year.
- ROTC’s primary mission: develop commissioned officers who are leaders, people of character.
