After the artists are paid their share and expenses are accounted for, the net proceeds will go to support youth programs of our club and the Thompson Education Foundation, as well as three art scholarships. This annual fundraiser and cultural event would not have been possible, again, if it were not for the generosity of the sponsors and art purchasers, as well as the efforts of our volunteers.

Chris White (*Pulliam Bldg Update*): Chris summarized

the results of the recent club member survey about issues pursuant to the club moving its weekly meetings to the newly renovated Pulliam Community Building in downtown Loveland. Some results:



- Not really a referendum on moving to the building, the survey was designed to gather members' opinions about pros and cons of moving there.
- Slightly more than half the club is amenable to increasing dues for a different type of lunch and the recyclable food service items necessary.
- A clear majority of members don't want to change caterers.
- Although most members like the idea of moving to the downtown location, most members are also very concerned about the scarcity of parking and unwilling to consider carpooling.
- There is much concern about the future unavailability of committee meeting space.
- A large number are not concerned about reimbursing our club's foundation for the \$175,000 donation that was made.
