Laura Armstrong talked to the club about the Heart J Center for Experiential Learning that uses resources at Sylvan Dale for learning opportunities. The Ranch is west of Loveland and is 3000 acres that has been a guest ranch since 1914. The family decided after the 2013 flood to build the education center. The Center started by serving youth groups and school groups for outdoor education. Now, they offer adult education, overnight retreats, universities and research projects, veterans programs. Sylvan Dale is also donating the ranch to the nonprofit Heart J Center for programs.
