August 20th. HISTORY: April 26, 1995 - In 1942 Ray Patterson joined Rotary and for 54 years had perfect attendance. During this time he proposed 154 people for membership. He was Secretary of the club for 40 years and then his son **Evan Patterson** succeeded him for the subsequent 10 years. He was President in 1946-47 and served as District Governor in 1979-80.

July 12, 1995 - **Darrell Brubaker** was elected to a second term as club president for the 1995 -1996 year after serving the 1988 - 1989 year as president and is the only Rotarian in the history of the club to serve two full terms. September 5, 1995 - At a recent Board meeting the Contract with Clark Construction of the amphitheater in North Lake Park was approved by the Board.

PROGRAM: Dick Schilling introduced Libby Colbert who has worked for the City of Fort Collins for 20 years and for the Art in Public Places group Pianos About Town. Libby has a BA from Michigan Univ and a Masters in Art Administration from Ohio State. Pianos About Town started in 2002, and was designed to encourage and enhance artistic expression and value. The Bohemian Foundation, APP, and the Downtown Development Authority wanted a program that offered a combination of public visual art and music for enjoyment along with highlighting new artists. Pianos are all donated in good working order and are prepped for artists to paint. The artists are selected via a juried process every February with 10-15 artists selected annually. The painting process is part of the Art in Action Program and is done from May 15-October 31 with a couple pianos painted indoors during the winter. When the pianos are decommissioned. they are first offered to the artist and then are taken apart with the parts being recycled or reused.
