Diane Lapierre (Art Show Summary): Diane gave many statistics on the success of the art show, including total sales of over \$175K, payments to artists of \$101K, and sales income to our club and TV of \$11K each.

Jerry Westbrook informed us of the recent death of two former club members: John Boose and Jim Scudamore.

PROGRAM: Leah Johnson, a former Loveland City Councilor and member of the Affordable Housing Task Force, spoke to the club about affordable housing in Loveland. A key metric for housing affordability is the “Area Median Income” (AMI). Unfortunately, growth in home count in Loveland has been dominated by those with incomes greater than 120% of AMI, while it has dropped for those with 80-120% of AMI. One surprising result of this has been that of the 35,000 jobs in Loveland, over 27,000 (77%) are held by those commuting here; Loveland housing prices are too high for many working here. The Task Force has identified and is working with others to implement several solutions to this problem, including micro homes and cottage housing, as well as several developments like the Crossroads Church Development shown to the right.
