yRYLA & RYLA: Andrew Haines introduced Hattie Guthrie (yRYLA) and Maddie Barcewski (RYLA) who shared some of their reactions to the camps. Both felt the camp was an important learning experience in many ways. Maddie summarized her learnings: Knowing the "why" of what you want is crucial to effectiveness; you can't give from an empty cup (take care of yourself); balance what the world needs, what you are great at, and what you love to do; feel vulnerable and embrace it; a good leader is a good listener.

PROGRAM: Gary Camp introduced Mary Camp who discussed "And How are the Children" which was centered around trends in child abuse. There are many different symptoms of abuse and 40 categories of people who are designated as mandatory reporters when these are noticed. Suspicion of child abuse is not necessarily a provable offense and there are various types (sexual, physical, domestic, medial, educational). And what are the solutions or where do the children go? There is a civil process referred to as the "Children's Code." When there is danger of imminent harm and preponderance of evidence children can be removed from abusive situations via emergency hearings. About 8% of child abuse problems have an intact family situation. There is also a continuing trend of grandparents

raising grandchildren as a result of these situations.
