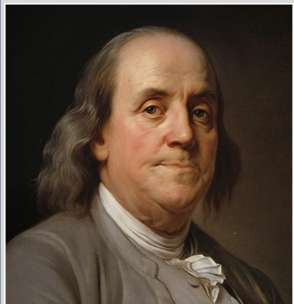

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

Diane Abshire and Ed Hildenbrand, both veterans of Larimer County Search and Rescue (LCSAR), shared the history and harrowing stories of how this nonprofit, totally volunteer organization saves people's lives all year round. In a typical year, LCSAR touches over 4,000 people with its quick response to searches and rescues and its wilderness education programs. Their motto is "So that Others may Live."
