• S. Korea, though smaller than its northern neighbor, has twice as many people. • The Korean alphabet (with 40 letters vs. the 25,000 characters of Chinese) was



invented to help the poor learn to read. • Strict gun laws result in only 50 gun deaths/yr. (vs. 49,000/yr. in U.S.) • S. Korea's architecture (both traditional and modern), sand sculptures at the beaches, and nighttime lighting displays over the cities' skylines are just a few of the breathtaking discoveries that await you here.
