John Stewart (with occasional backup from **Chris White**) briefly summed up results of the 2020 Duck Race. A full presentation is expected on Sep 8. Loveland H.S. senior Sydney Hall was proud sponsor of the winning (small) duck and winner of the 1st prize of \$1,000, which (amid tears of joy) she said will make her 18th birthday wish (trip to Disney World) a reality!

Julie Johnson-Haffner was happy to report that the recently closed COVID-19 Relief Fund succeeded in funding 15 projects that addressed COVID-related community needs including food, shelter, clothing, childcare, and mental-health assistance.

PROGRAM

Our own **Dave Mills** (introduced by **Brian Nienhaus**) gave a highly informative talk with loads of detailed slides on "The Future of Electric Vehicles." Highlights included the following (NOTE: EV = pure electric + plug-in hybrid models):

- By 2025, industry analysts forecast a 10% increase in EV sales to 8.5 million vehicles per year
- EV sales in Colorado totaled 211,653 (2018)
- Charging stations in Colorado = 710 (2018)
- Colorado currently gives a \$4,000 tax credit for purchase of EV (all models)
- Reasons to buy an EV include lower fuel cost, lower maint cost, zero air pollution, alleviate global warming, reduce U.S. oil dependence, they're fun to drive, and... typically brakes last for life of car
- In 2020, EV SUVs are hitting the road
- Starting in 2021, more and more of the following EVs will be seen: pick-up trucks, buses, fire trucks, and semi trucks (18-wheelers!)
