Paige Listen, LCSW, of SummitStone, gave us a great overview of the new Longview Behavioral Health Center. A few highlights: • The funding for the new facility comes from the 2018 sales tax bill passed by voters. • **Levels of Care:** 24x7 behavioral health urgent care: withdrawal management; a crisis stabilization unit; upcoming expanding bed capacity and opioid treatment services. • Facts: 75% of clients are voluntary | much valuable data is being gathered on an ongoing basis |
