LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

This double-feature program by our International Committee included the following highlights:

Mixteca Water Filter Project



John Turnage spoke about the water filter project in Mexico: • These relatively low-cost, easy-to-install water filters provide clean drinking water for indigenous people who need it badly. • The people of Mixteca region (Southern Mexico) are already good at capturing their scarce rain water - but it is not potable. • Rotarians are invited to join this team (incl Mexican Rotarians) in Spring 2024 for 7-10 days to help set-up, distribute, and educate the locals on these filters. • Cost is only \$1,500 (airfare + 1 hotel night).



Mark Anderson inspired us with the horse medicine project for Indian reservations in AZ & NM: • Horses in Navajo land are sorely in need of proper veterinary care. • This project (giving 12 vet students college credit) gave 400 horses vaccinations, dental care, hoof trimming, and other vital medical care.
