#### **PROGRAM**

In a highly informative presentation, titled "Venice and the Origins of Music," **Chris White** explained how the history and geography of Venice impacted the development and characteristics of Western music. He answered three big questions: Why is Venice. . .



- I) ... the birthplace of instrumental music? ANSWER: Partly because Venice was an independent city-state (free from domination by Rome), it not only pioneered music printing but also adopted Byzantine domes for its churches, posing acoustic challenges—all of which led to the newer homophonic, orchestral music we hear so much, today.
- the birthplace of music conservatories? ANSWER:
   The chapels adjoining Venice hospitals became orphanages where young girls were taught music; these later evolved into for-profit music schools for talented young people, in general.
- 3) ... the reason why musical performance instructions are written in the Italian language? ANSWER: Venetians' newer type of music, using multiple choirs of singers and instruments, required composers to specify instruments, tempos, and musical dynamics in their printed musical scores.
