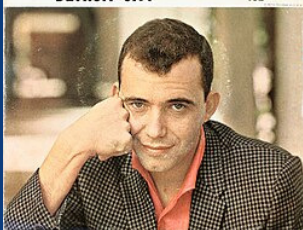

He discussed the major challenge of creating and maintaining quality facilities on a very limited budget.
