Dwight Brummet (Member in Crisis): Please keep **John Stewart** in your thoughts and prayers. He was hospitalized this week for a brain aneurism.

Jerry Westbrook (100 Years and Counting): In 2011-12, Rotary's theme ("Embrace Humanity") was put into action when Loveland Rotary, partnering with five other service clubs, embarked on a seven-year house-painting project that ended up painting 79 homes (worth \$22,000 per year to the community)!

Ron Weinberg (Election 2020): Larimer County will have NO in-person voting. Simply follow rules for mail-in/drop-off ballots (going out Oct 9). You must drop-off (do not mail) your ballot within 10 days of Nov 3 election! Additional drop-off sites will be available at King Soopers locations.

Jim Epstein (New District Grant): A single \$1,000 Governor's Grant is available until October 15, to any club that puts up the first \$500. The grant must be used for a local project, an undergraduate scholarship, or a RYLA scholarship.

PROGRAM

Jessie Creamean, PhD (CSU atmospheric research scientist featured in April 2020 *Smithsonian* magazine), who's participated in five different science expeditions in the Arctic, spoke to club members about the vital research related to climate change being conducted as part of the MOSAiC project. Highlights of her talk:

- the Arctic is warming twice as much as other regions, which impacts weather all over the planet
- tiny organisms (bacteria, algae) along with pollen and dust particles have a big impact on formation of Arctic clouds, which affect the Arctic sea ice
- understanding how these Arctic clouds form is an important piece of the climate change puzzle
- polar bears treat scientific equipment like toys
- the Arctic is a bizarre world with a strange beauty
- MOSAiC involves 20 nations, more than 700 scientists, \$180 million, and "a whole lotta fun"!
