NEWS FROM OUR LAST "VIRTUAL" MEETING:

Clint presented the Rotary Prayer and Ajay presented the Pledges.

Our special guest was John Pororny. John is a longtime, very active Rotarian at the District level, from Lewisville.

Also attending for the first time in quite awhile was Tom Ostovich. Tom is a returning member from a leave of absence. It's very good to see you again. Welcome back!

Jeani announced a club anniversary for Mike Crocker.

TODAY'S MEETING WAS A CLUB ASSEMBLY.

Mike Crocker went over the **Avenue of Club Service:** Our spring blood drive at SAFB is in limbo because of the pandemic. Our supply of books for the library at River Bend is good. We have donated \$500.00 to Interfaith Services and have that amount left to donate. We have donated \$500.00 to the WF Area Food Bank and have that amount left to donate. The club has donated \$1,000.00 to River Bend and a Rotary District Matching Grant matched the donation. We have the dictionaries on hand to donate to Scotland Park and the West Foundation Elementary Schools. Members are going to meet Sunday at 3:00 PM at Troy's office to put labels in the dictionaries so that we can get them delivered. The club has purchased \$690.00 worth of food for the community food bank at Scotland Park. The club has \$310.00 earmarked for further purchases. Club members have purchased snacks for the student food pantry at Scotland Park, All of the food will be delivered to Scotland Park this morning.

Rotary North donated \$150.00 to the district polio fund raised. We donated \$500.00 to the Norma Love Foundation to help the relief efforts after the recent hurricanes in Honduras. We have earmarked \$1,160.00 for 1/3 of the repairs for the flag area the MPEC. The club spent \$281.54 for a local family from the Scotland Park area for Christmas.

There was no report for the **Avenue of Vocational Service**.

Jeani gave the report over **The Rotary Foundation**. She will try to send in all donations to TRF today so that the funds can be matched by the district.

Troy reported on the **Avenue of International Service**: He went over the uncertainties of international travel during the pandemic. Rotary's international programs such as Youth Exchange and Global Grant Scholars are currently on hold. Troy also went over the possibility of submitting a Global Grant to benefit River Bend.

Clint gave the report for the **Avenue Club Service**: The club is planning to have a social event in April, if the conditions permit.

Clint over the **Avenue of Youth Service**: There will be a local virtual 4-Way Test Speech Contest. It is unknown at this time if RYLA will be held this year.

There was a discussion about the flag display program:

Gary made a motion to raise the flag subscription rate to \$30.00. Rob seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Tom Sheriff made a motion to NOT display the flags on 911. Troy seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Some local clubs are proposing to display the flags for a week during February to promote awareness about wearing masks during the pandemic. Rotary North decided NOT to participate in this event.
