GUEST SPEAKER



Last week we heard an interesting talk from Sharon Treasure who is the Audiometrist at Active Hearing Aid Professionals situated in Riviera Plaza, Bairnsdale. Sharon set up her business in Sale ten years ago and expanded to Bairnsdale twelve months ago after purchasing Connie Cunningham's business.

Her passion is helping others with their hearing problems and she loves dealing with people. She performs hearing tests, fits hearing aids and works with rehabilitating patients to improve their hearing. She finds that the rehabilitation is the most challenging part of her work. She believes strongly that the most successful people are those who are ready and willing to do something about their hearing problems.

Her first step is to test the hearing levels of patients to find the softest threshold of their hearing and also to find any other issues before proceeding. There may be a requirement for medical intervention which she can recommend. The most common problems are tinnitus which is ringing in the ears, wax build up and the need for hearing aids. These work best when they are not kept in the bedside table drawer.

The advancements in technology has made available Bluetooth and wireless connectivity to help those who cannot hear well. These technologies can be adapted for mobile and home phones, Television and I-pad which give access to sound.
