Guest Speaker

Last week we had Leah Radatti talk to us about her journey to becoming a lawyer. She was born in Sale growing up in a loving family and safe community. She talked about family, education, safety, food and employment being a basic human right that is not available for everyone around the world.

What seems to have been a life changing trip to outback Australia at the age of 16, to the Santa Teresa community near Alice Springs, helped lead her on the path that she took. When she returned home from that experience she had a fire in her belly to learn more about social justice and an aspiration to become a human rights lawyer.

She used that fire to complete six years of study in Melbourne whilst working at Luna Park and volunteering at the Victorian Aboriginal Legal Service in Preston. During her second year she was selected to participate in a nationwide internship program, through the Aurora Project and got a placement at the Kimberley Institute in Broome, WA.

The following year she participated again the same internship program but in Cairns, where she worked at the Wet Tropics Management Authority. She spent the semester learning about management and care of UNESCO Daintree Rainforest and working with local authorities, communities and indigenous people.

During her third year of study, together with members of her family she went to the Netherlands and decided to apply for a semester of study at the Hague, which is known as the Peace City and the Legal Capital of the World. On the 4 September 2014, she was sitting in the International Criminal Tribunal for Yugoslavia, watching the criminal trial or Goran Hadzic.

She graduated in 2016 from Victoria University with a Bachelor of Law (Honours) and a Bachelor or Arts, majoring in Psychology. It was at this point that she decided to take a break and spent some time abroad in India and Morocco. On returning to Australia Leah made the trip back to Santa Teresa and this is where she completed her practical component before the formal process of admission, to become an officer of the court.

She completed five weeks of volunteering at the Northern Australian Aboriginal Justice Agency which provides criminal and civil law services to Aboriginal people in the far north of Australia. Another life changing experience as she shadowed lawyers around the courtroom travelling to outback courts in very remote communities. During this time she had a tour of the Dondale Youth Prison, which was featured in a Four Corners Report, which obviously had a profound effect on Leah.

In August last year she returned to Gippsland to be close to family and began working at Anglicare in Morwell, as a youth justice group conference convenor, where she works closely with offending youth in the Latrobe area. In March this year she was accepted as an Australian Lawyer in the Supreme Court of Victoria and was successful in applying for the community lawyer position at the Gippsland Community Legal Service.

What is next you might ask? Leah applied to attend the One Young World Summit, an event that will be held in the Hague, Netherlands in October and yes you guessed it, she was accepted. She is very excited by this opportunity and especially being able to hear her very own idol Amal Clooney, present to the attendees.

We were more than impressed by this delightful young lady, who has achieved so much in her 25 years. A decision was made to present her with a cheque for \$500.00 to assist with the expenses for

the trip. We are looking forward to hearing about her experienc when she returns, one very motivated young lady and potential Rotarian I would say.
