Guest Speaker

Local Attorney and fellow Rotarian Club member of Bairnsdale- Ian Campbell spoke Tuesday, 6th February, 2018 regarding the topic- 'Power of Attorney.'

Power of Attorney Definition: - A Power of Attorney (P.O.A.) is a legal document giving one person (the agent) the power to act on behalf of another person. This agent will act as a broad legal authority to make legal decisions about the principal's property or financial affairs.

Banks and Law firms usually hold the original signed Power of Attorney's document. This document has to be signed and witness by a qualified witness-usually a Justice of the Peace Lawyer.

P.O.A's must be a minimum 18 years of age and be able to represent a person in a mature and trustworthy manner. They must not disclose of any information which they have authorised and should keep written accurate records of any work undertaken.

The P.O.A. role ceases once the person they are acting on behalf of passes away. If this occurs an Executor of the person's 'Will' takes over. Sometimes these two roles can be conducted by the same person.

A separate document is a Medical Power of Attorney which authorises medical decisions to be made on behalf of the principal. Ian is more than happy to discuss with any fellow Rotarian member or friends or family if you would like any further information regarding this topic
