GUEST SPEAKER

At our last meeting we had Gerry Ciavarella give a very informative talk on the music program at the Bairnsdale Secondary College. Gerry has been involved with music for many years and it was very apparent how much he enjoys his job.

It is not only secondary students who benefit from the program, as students from Bairnsdale West and Paynesville Primary schools are brought to the college to have tuition. Music lessons are 30 minutes long and held at the music centre, all participants must ensure that they keep up with their academic studies. There is a music festival where musicians from all schools get together to play, this year it was at Orbost and next year will be in Lakes Entrance. There can be between 80-100 students on the stage at any one time.

There are several ensembles formed at the college and they are in great demand to play for various organisations, the Smith Family, Eagle Point Primary School, Eastwood Retirement Village and Clifton Water Retirement Village. There was a Big Band competition and in Division 3, they were placed 5 out of 32, a good result!

The Senior Strings are going on an eight day trip/tour and will travel from the Gold Coast down to Batemans Bay, participating in workshops and giving concerts. The college has a policy that no child will miss out due to financial circumstances and always ensure that every member is able to attend the various tours etc. Of course this means that there is always fundraising happening and support from local organisations are more than welcome.

Gerry is very proud of this highly successful program and reported that some students have gone on to university to train as music teachers and perhaps further, pursuing a career in music. It was also clear how much Gerry loves Bairnsdale and hopefully he will be here for a good time longer imparting his extensive knowledge to the youth of this area.

During our meeting Gerry treated us to some wonderful music on his saxophone, what a way to spend the evening!!!
