UPDATE ON THE HOPE RESTART CENTRE

It was interesting to hear how far this project has proceeded since Peter and Margaret Down, spoke to us all those months ago.

It all began in November 2015, a suitable site was given to them and so started the planning. Within seven months they had been granted a permit through the town planning for 112 bed facility. They had three objections but these people did not go any further with it, by the required 21 day period, so it was full steam ahead.

Darren Chester took up the cause with the Federal Government, but the hoped for 12 million was halved to 6 million and the number of beds cut. As we all know it does not matter how many beds you have, the infrastructure costs are the same which includes electrical, fibre optics, sewer lines and its own sewerage treatment plant. So now starts the hard work of raising the other monies required. The State Government has been approached but as yet no positive reply. Philanthropic trusts have been approached and some donated services have been received, but the plan is to try and raise as much money as they can at this point

The facility will be under the auspice of Odyssey House, Melbourne who will train the staff and support the centre. The hope is that this will be a centralised place for all the Drug and Alcohol Agencies operating in this area. This will be a first in Australia and will not replace what is already in place but join everyone together. They will do physiological assessments and rehabilitation and hopefully will be able to offer earlier treatments for those in need.

It will cost about \$8500.00 per bed per year, but all these ongoing costs will be met by Odyssey House. Fed Training will use it as a training ground for potential employees and together will all the other supporting services a possible \$500,000.00 per employee will be injected into our local economy. This may prove to be a pilot for perhaps nine other facilities around Australia.


