Guest Speaker

Last week we had Gael Rand and Margaret Lomas from the Bairnsdale & District Art Society talk about the Glorious Gippsland Art Show.

Bairnsdale's **Glorious Gippsland** Art Exhibition is simply the biggest and most prestigious display of artworks on show in East Gippsland.

The biennial show is the product of a lot of hard work, planning and promotion by an enthusiastic and committed Committee of volunteers from the Bairnsdale & District Arts Society. The first two Exhibitions (2013 & 2015) were held over 2 days and achieved outstanding success.

In 2017 we held the event over the 4 days of Easter and this show received a record amount of Art entries (almost 400) from the local area, Melbourne, regional and interstate Artists. The very experienced and eminent Judge declared the organisation and presentation of the Exhibition highly professional and a great credit to the Arts Society. He also commented that the artworks presented were of a very high standard.

The Judge of the Show is chosen for their vast knowledge of art and most hail from Melbourne (not locally) to ensure their impartiality. Interestingly, East Gippsland artists received a high percentage of the prizes at each show. I guess proving again how strong art is in our district and the exceptional talent of our local Artists.

In 2017, 1600 people came through the Exhibition and the event was widely acclaimed on TV, radio and print media and by the viewing public, both locals and tourists. By any measure it was an enormous success.

Bairnsdale's 'Glorious Gippsland' Easter Art Exhibition is now recognised as a major tourist event for Bairnsdale and is widely promoted as such.

None of this could have been achieved without sponsorship support by local organisations and businesses. In 2015 this Rotary Club was the major sponsor of the Glorious Gippsland Art Exhibition, providing \$1500 to the overall 'Best in Show' winner. This was a great contribution and was so appreciated by all at the Art Society

The Society also does 'community service' work such as presenting an Art Show at the Bairnsdale Agricultural Show, giving Art Scholarships to young artists to encourage and support their pursuit of art goals, provide volunteers to assist in provision of School Holiday art at the Bairnsdale Library.

We certainly hope the Rotary Club of Bairnsdale can again assist us stage and present a great event that is the Glorious Gippsland Art Show in 2019.

A short History of the Society

The Bairnsdale and District Arts Society has been in existence since 1981. The original members, some of whom are still members today, raised the money to buy the little church which began its life in 1891 as the Lucknow Presbyterian Church. It was moved to GLENALADALE in 1920 and finally came to its present home in 1986. It was renovated and later extended by the Society.

They all worked hard organising exhibitions and sales to raise the money. Prices being what they are I doubt if this would be achievable today. The Council came to the party with the block of land and we have a very good ongoing relationship with them. The effort was well worth it as the building is now a centre for learning about art and enjoying art, open to all comers young, old, experienced and beginners who all help and encourage each other.

I myself became a member in the late 1980's and have watched it grow and improve over the years. When I joined the membership was about 60-65 it is now about 170 something of which the present committee and its office bearers should be proud. We are very proud that the Bairnsdale and District Ars Society is now the leading Community Art Group in East Gippsland.

The Arts Society now has classes for members on most days of the week, we have at least 5 weekend workshops with visiting artists every year We started an after school class for children. We know from experience that life will get in the way of art for some of them but most will return to it as they get older. We have renovated and updated the Facilities which are now first rate, well kept and well stocked.

At this point I put my hand up and said that for a few years I had had a dream of an exhibition in Bairnsdale called Glorious Gippsland and somehow it was quickly agreed that we would go for it and seeing as it was my idea I would be the leader of the committee. A lot of hard work was put in and all the things we have done with funds raised but back then we really did not realise just what we were taking on. I did the job of leading the committee for the first two times then Gael took over and this will be her second time. Thank goodness we decided to make it every second year from the start; it gives us all a bit of breathing space.
