The farmers themselves have been instrumental in organising the containers from various sources and will clean after the first pickup and transfer to Ensay for the second pickup. Ben Gritt 'Ceramicist'

Last week Ben Gritt, Ceramicist spoke to us about himself and his work. Ben was accompanied by mentor and friend Malcolm Boyd, a name famous in this area for his wonderful pottery.

Malcolm spoke about himself and his involvement in the local pottery group. Malcolm told us that there is very little in Bairnsdale for artists with disabilities. With the work he has done with these groups, he knows that they enjoy creating and develop when pursuing art.

Ben has been blind since he was six years old, but during those years he had an artistic bent and used to draw. It was several years later that he took up pottery and using childhood memories was able to create some amazing pieces. Malcolm has been instrumental in encouraging Ben's talent, firing all his work in his own kilns.



Ben had brought along some of his pieces, the most lifelike boot, sea shells and a rabbit straight out of Beatrice Potter. Pat Phillips has said it was amazing to see him work with the pieces, often having to hold them close to his face so that he can see some of the detail that he is creating.

All of Ben's pieces are sculptured, no throwing on the wheel, just building it up one piece of clay at the time, although the seashells are made out of a single piece of clay! Malcolm often helps him with the colours and glazing, even telling an amusing story of when Ben insisted that the sculpture of a rabbit had the tiniest of shoelaces on the small shoes. It was obvious that Malcolm was very impressed with Ben's talent which came across as he spoke of his work. Ben on the other hand is very quietly spoken, but his love of pottery was very apparent.



Ben would love to be able to hold an exhibition in town, but local gallery's

are booked out for two years, plus the cost to hire the space is high and out of reach of many artists including Ben. What would be ideal is to use one of the vacant shops in town and create a popup shop. He is quite a prolific artist and has many, many pieces that are worthy of being shown to the public.

Ben used to have a seeing eye dog, but with recent operations, he has been retired. Luckily for Ben his mother has adopted his dog so that he can still see his mate, but this has meant that he is back using a cane.

Thank you to Ben for giving us an insight into your world and bringing along some of your superb pottery.
